Hysan Development x NGOs/Social Enterprises Boost Harmony in the Community Kick off Ceremony for "Hysan Community Initiative - Elderly Household U-traps and Ventilation Checking and Maintenance Project" Free Checkup & Maintenance of Drainage Pipes for 100 To Kwa Wan residents

A leader in communal spirit, Hysan Development has long been devoted to connecting its neighbours via outreach events. Today (July 18), Hysan Development hosted the Kick off Ceremony for "Hysan Community Initiative - Elderly Household U-traps and Ventilation Checking and Maintenance Project" – an initiative launched by Hysan Development in partnership



with Longevity Group, the S.K.H. Holy Carpenter Church Community Centre, Kowloon City Centre for Active Ageing, The Lok Sin Tong Benevolent Society Kowloon as well as the youth ambassadors of UOW College Hong Kong. With the help of social enterprises, the project reached out to around 100 elderly living in isolation or in need (non-public housing personnel) in To Kwa Wan from June to August, 2022 via home visitations, complementary check-up and maintenance of u-shaped drains, application of bactericidal coating for disinfection, plus presentation of a pandemic relief gift pack.

Gracing the Kick off Ceremony today were Winnie Wong, General Manager, Projects of Hysan Development; Mark Tung, General Manager & Head of Corporate Communications of Hysan Development; as well as representatives from its project partners Longevity Design House, S.K.H. Holy Carpenter Church Community Centre, Kowloon City Centre for Active Ageing, The Lok Sin Tong Benevolent Society Kowloon as well as the youth ambassadors of UOW College Hong Kong. They all cheered on the project and shared how such a compelling partnership between corporate, business, social enterprises and schools had a positive impact on the To Kwa Wan community.

During the COVID-19 pandemic fifth wave earlier this year, Hysan Development took note of the need for supplies in To Kwa Wan and immediately reacted by offering relief packs composed of RAT tests, food, surgical masks, alcoholic disinfectants and hand warmers, partnered with a number of To Kwa Wan NGOs. Aside from lending a helping hand to the elderly, Hysan donated 250 medical-grade air purifiers to small merchants and community groups to ensure they can provide services at the frontline with more protection against the virus.

Cross-generation partnership is a key element in this project. With the help of UOW College Hong Kong, 10 to 20 university students from the Social Work department take on the responsibility of Youth Ambassadors in home visitations. These ambassadors received training so as to truly understand the needs of the elderly. Apart from showing care to the elderly through gifting the care packages, they will also conduct simple assessment on whether the homes' settings are elderly-friendly or not and help apply the nanoAce Liquid Household Photocatalyst Spray. Other professionals are on hand to conduct thorough check-ups for the drainage pipes, and offer other simple home improvement services.

Through spreading the message of hygiene care at home, we hope to reduce their risk of contracting the virus." Lui adds that the youth ambassadors recruited for this project are devoted and passionate to improving the lives of the elderly.

During the discussion panel, partnered social enterprises – Longevity Group, the S.K.H. Holy Carpenter Church Community Centre, Kowloon City Centre for Active Ageing and The Lok Sin Tong Benevolent Society Kowloon – reveal the challenges in offering effective community services for the elderly, especially those living in isolation, given that that To Kwa Wan is an old community packed with sub-divided homes. The social enterprises are glad to have received support from Hysan Development and training from Longevity Group so they can optimise the resources in every part of the community.
